

Hospital Thank You Ride

Mike Stafinbil has put together a short ride for the purpose of thanking the first responders at Kaiser Hospital. This will be on Friday May 22nd, as stay-at-home restrictions are being somewhat lifted. We will leave Orchard Creek at 2:30 PM. We will follow the leader, not get out of our cars and use the radios to communicate.

Mike has been in touch with the PR folks at the hospital. He got an enthusiastic response. Mike also talked to the Roseville PD Public Information Officer who said no problem and we agreed to give him a heads up a few days in advance.

We will have 4 groups. Don't arrive too early because we won't be getting out of our cars. When you do arrive, just spread out and line up behind any of the leaders. We will be following the leaders over to the hospital.

Please bring your radios tuned to channel 6 and sub-code (eliminator code) 0, and all other optional settings turned off. You should see a large 6 and a small 0 for the channel. If you set up your radios this way, you will help eliminate a lot of the random beeps and rings that we sometimes hear.

We will head to Roseville the back way via Stoneridge, Sierra College and Taylor Road. We will turn left on Eureka, and right into the hospital campus. Two more quick right turns will take us to Kaiser's Parking Lot 10 which we will use as a staging area. Just line up in the order you arrive, there is plenty of room. After that, just follow along. We plan to make the loop around the hospital 3 times, which should cover their shift change period between 2:45 and 3:15.

Even though masks are not required if we stay in our cars, please wear your masks when we are actually driving around the hospital grounds. That should be a nice show of support and provide a good visual.

We do need a little help. We don't have as many signs as we thought we would. We will pass out the signs we have, but if you feel inclined, please make a sign for yourself and one for a buddy. That would really help. A simple message, like "Thank You" is all that is needed, but make the letters large and dark so they can be read some distance off.

And, by the way, we will have someone from our Lincoln Hills Communications Committee taking a video of us for E News when we go through their central loop, so smile!
